A message from Mrs Harris our Headteacher: The sun is finally shining and school is busy, busy, busy...it was fantastic to see so many families and friends who were able to come along to support the children at Sports Day. The children all did incredibly well and showed great sportsmanship to one another. Preparations for the Dance Festival are well under way, in every corner of the school you will find a child or teacher dancing at the moment! The children are also working hard on some final pieces of artwork that will be displayed in the Art Exhibition, for you to come and view in a few weeks' time. This is always a great celebration of some of wonderful, creative pieces of art that the children choose to celebrate. Year 6 children are singing, learning lines and rehearsing all in preparation for their end of Year production, 'Oh What a Night'. The children are already so proud of how the rehearsals are going so we are very excited for the final production!

Attendance – our whole school target remains at 96.4% and currently it is 94%. A big well done to Reception last week who, as a year group, achieved the highest attendance across the school and to Lilac Class for being the class to achieve the highest attendance. Well done! Please do remember that it is vital if your child is not in school, that you inform us as soon as possible. If you don't inform us and we can't get hold of you, we are required to call all the contacts on your child's contact list until we are able to speak to someone and contact yourself. Thank you for your help with this.

Parent Governor – as you will know we had four parents who were nominated for the role of being a Parent Governor, which is great. Voting for this closes this Wednesday 26th June, please do remember to go into the school office to have your vote. The role of a Parent Governor is a very important one, so please do get involved and have your say.

The roof over the Reception corridor is being replace, work on this started a few weeks ago but is about to start in full and this will involve some scaffolding going up in the KS1 and Nursery Playground. We are not anticipating that this will cause an interference, but if you do have any concerns or questions, please do let the office staff know. Thank you.

At the children's request, we are using money raised at the Christmas Fair and that we won for gaining the most amount of blue tokens in two Tesco stores, to have the graphics all re painted on the Key Stage 2 playground and some new graphics added in. We are just wating for a final date for this. We are continuing to fund raise for some new climbing equipment!

What has been happening across our school

Year 1 – Year 1 kicked off their new topic 'Crash, Bang, Wallop!' with a fabulous music workshop. The children all learnt how to play a Bamboo Tamboo and Djembe drum, they listened well and played some rather tricky rhythms. We have some budding musicians amongst us..!



Year 4 – Recently, the children learnt about the Ancient Greek times, which was the hook into their learning. The children had to use their inference skills to work out what the artefacts were. They played with Ancient Greek spinning tops, which were quite tricky to use. The last part of the session the children acted out different Greek Myths, including Theseus and the Minotaur as well as Medusa. It was great fun!





Nursery - are

embracing all things insect related. They are reading a story by the same author Eric Carle, 'The very busy spider.' We've learnt some spider facts and are going to go on a 'Bug Hunt'. We will even make some homes for insects too.

Reception have

been enjoying watching caterpillars grow, connected to their story 'The Hungry Caterpillar'. They have been mapping out the story in order to start writing a longer piece of writing. We are so proud of their progress in writing this year.

Year 2 - To start off our new topic Coast to Coast, in Year 2, we visited West Wittering beach, a truly memorable experience for the children and surely one of the highlights of their years at primary school. The visit although quite recreational, also gave the children a first-hand experience about coastlines and different animals and habitats that are found along the coast.



In Science, we are learning about habitats and are learning about living and non-living things for which the children went on an exciting and adventurous walk around school to look for different mini beasts!

Year 3 - This half term, we started our topic 'Eco Warriors' with a wonderful trip to the 'Wetland Centre' in Barnes. The children had a fantastic time exploring the beautiful lakes and wildlife areas. We learnt about how we can look after our planet by being more mindful of the plastic waste that is created.

Year 5 are well into their topic - Terrible Tudors! They have enjoyed analysing portraits of Henry VIII, thinking about the image he wanted to show. They will be creating their own versions,

using grid drawing to help them to achieve this. In English, they are writing stories where

people are transported to new places through a portal.

Year 6 - are well into their final half term with us at Fairholme and we just can't believe it! They have begun their transition activities with a Transport for London workshop focused on traveling safely to secondary school.

Excitement is building for their 'Come Dine With Me' cooking day, inspired by the flavours of Mexico.

Trained Anti-Bullying Ambassadors at Fairholme

At the end of May, we were lucky enough to be able to take 10 children in Year 4 and Year 5 to Anti-Bullying Ambassador Training, organised by The Diana Award. They took part in a variety of activities, including looking at what it feels like to be bullied, what strategies they can use to promote kindness, a definition of what bullying is (and isn't), how they can help solve problems, and some scenarios where

they had to decide what behaviour was and was not bullying.



Maths

Both in KS1 and KS2 we use a range of strategies to help support children in accessing different operations that are linked to their understanding of place value.

Here are 2 methods/models that we consistently use in school. If appropriate to do so, ask your child if they can demonstrate how they would use them. The more practise they have in using and applying these methods the more confident they will be in their mathematical thinking.

Addition 60 + 30 = 7 60 + 30 = 90 Multiplication $4 \times 5 = 7$ 5 $4 \times 5 = 20$	Subtraction 90-30 = 7 90-30 = 60 Division 25 + 5 = 7 25 25 25 5 = 5	more and more popular in schools across the UK due to its success within the Singaporean education system. It works by showing a clear visual representation of a calculation and we use them across the school as the children can draw them easily on the squared paper in their maths books to help with the calculations they are performing. Some examples can be seen to the left.

Have some fun with your child and maths:

- Play the estimating game Who can guess how long the journey will take?
- Try to find patterns of shapes petals, brickwork, paving etc
- Use timers and scales when cooking.....and so on!
