Maths

A website with maths activities for children that we will soon begin to use to set maths homework, in addition to the Maths Passports.

An excellent website with links to games such as Bingo. Covers all the main areas of maths such as: measures, four operations, fractions, place value, percentages. The games can be played as a family or independently.

Maths Frame - <http://mathsframe.co.uk>

A website full of maths games related to curriculum. On the homepage, click Resources > New Maths > Curriculum 2014 and then choose relevant area (your children will be able to tell you what they're currently working on in class). A list of games will appear with a snapshot of what they look like. Worksheets are also available.

Good for the learning instant recall facts (e.g. number bonds, times tables). The site has games that children can play with the option of being timed or not.

Maths Zone - <http://mathszone.co.uk>

A huge array of maths games. It's easy to navigate and find game as you can search based on year group, area of maths and topic.
