Alphabet and Phonics	Speech, Language and Communication
Why not get your child working on their alphabet, they could create their own alphabet arc by writing all the letters on pieces of paper. They could then use the letters to make words/spellings and names. Knowing the order of the alphabet can help them with their spelling and phonics when using the alphabet arc. The theme of the week is the importance of friendships during lockdown.

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, we have all been living in lockdown. This means that many children and young people with a learning disability are feeling isolated, as they have been unable to see their friends. We know that people with a learning disability already experience high levels of loneliness and social isolation and that this may have been made worse by the lockdown. To keep in line with the theme, teach your children about the importance of friendship, being a good friend is an important life skill and many of your children will be missing their friends, maybe

they could video call them or send them a picture or letter.
