# FCAT Fylde Coast Academy Trust

## **OUTBREAK MANAGEMENT PLAN (RA)**

This outlines how FCAT will operate if additional measures are recommended for our setting or the local area. The Director of Public Health, United Kingdom Health Security Agency (UKHSA) Health Protection Teams or the Local Authority could recommend certain measures be re-introduced. This may happen to help manage outbreaks in schools, or if there is an "extremely high prevalence" of Covid-19 in the community and other measures have failed to reduce transmission, or as part of a package of measures "responding to a variant of concern". Local authorities, DsPH and HPTs are responsible for managing localised outbreaks. They play an important role in providing support and advice to education and childcare settings.

N.B- THE FOLLOWING CONTROL MEASURES DO NOT NEED TO BE PUT INTO PLACE UNLESS RECOMMENDED BY THE GOVERNMENT, DFE, DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC HEALTH, PHE HEALTH PROTECTION TEAMS OR THE LOCAL AUTHORITY.
