Dear headteachers,

I hope you are well. My name is Sabiha and I work for the National Centre for Computing (NCCE). I am the local Primary SME (Subject Matter Expert) assigned to Merseyside, Blackpool and Burnley areas and would love to help your schools at any stage of its computing curriculum journey.

The current FREE NCCE offer that your school could be eligible for can be found below;

Bespoke (0.5 days) Computing Curriculum Support

Collaboration on Computing schemes of work and further development for the school. This is to be delivered remotely at this time via Google Drive, video calls and/or emails etc to collaborate further.

Face to Face Courses

These are currently remote courses. All courses will be run on a monthly basis from the end of April. A £220 per day BURSARY is available for the first course that the Teacher/ Computing Lead attends (£440 for your school if a staff member signs up to KS1 or KS2 dual-module course). This is a perfect time to upskill more than one member of staff, whilst the courses are completely FREE!

STEM Learning and Teach Computing Resources

A chance to explore the resources available to help build short and medium-term plans and allow staff to add activities on as home STEM activities/ other.

All of these meetings are currently delivered online, so there is a chance to 'attend' whichever meeting is most convenient for your staff. There is also a host of resources and support available at these sessions.

Additional support available (these hours are in addition to your 0.5-day curriculum support)

- **Remote Learning-** Free support and training on using platforms such as Google Classroom, Microsoft Teams, ClassDojo, Showbie and Seesaw for delivering remote learning.
- Staff Updates- Free support on using a platform such as Google Meet for 'staff meetings'
- **Computing Curriculum/ Resource Repository-** Free support in teaching the computing curriculum remotely this year.
- **Computing Hub** Newsletter from your computing hub with support and resources for home learning and teaching of the computing curriculum. Please let me know if you wish to be added to this mailing list.
