Behaviour Hubs Announced

The government has confirmed the first 22 schools which will head up its £10 million behaviour hubs initiative. The behaviour hubs project, led by government behaviour tsar Tom Bennett, aims to support 500 schools which may need support over the next three years. It will begin at the start of the summer term. The initiative was due to begin in September last year but was delayed due to the impact of the pandemic. Lead schools and academy trusts will work closely with the schools they are supporting on improvement strategies and develop and launch new behaviour approaches and policies and provide ongoing mentoring and support. The behaviour hubs programme will run on a termly basis, with lead schools and MATs forming hubs with two different supported schools each term.
