Our new Reception Year group in September 2025

We will have 90 places – the number of siblings who will automatically be allocated a place is 39 currently.

The children will be placed in 3 parallel classes Each class will have one full-time teacher and one full-time teaching assistant.



What makes our school special?

- •We are an infant and nursery school the age range is only from 3 7 and the school is designed for young children. Our furniture, classrooms, outside areas are all geared towards little people!
- •Our children take on responsibility they are school council members, litter pickers, playground buddies, cloakroom monitors, to name but a few!
- •We work together to make our school a happy place.
- •We have a wellbeing team who ensure that the welfare of all children is supported.
- •Our children enjoy coming to school.
- We have an enduring good reputation for high standards of education and care.
- •Our children move straight to our adjoining federation junior school which they attend from the age of 7 11.



School Grounds

We are lucky to have beautiful school grounds which include two playgrounds and a field (shared with Junior school) as well as a purpose built "Quiet Corner".

Mrs. Long, our Learning Mentor has created a wonderful resource, accessible to all children, in the corner of our Key Stage 1 playground.

With funding help from our fantastic Parent Teacher Association (PTA), Mrs. Long worked with children in Year 2 as well as parent volunteers to clean, sweep, paint, build and plant and created a lovely calm area.







Home school links

We know that parents are the first educators of their children and have a fundamental role to play in supporting children's learning. We endeavour, therefore, to build a partnership between home and school that supports the learning and teaching of every child.





Parent workshops for Speech & Language, Reading and Maths allow us to share information about our teaching and offer advice on how parents/carers can support learning at home.

Each year group also has a contact email address for parents/carers to communicate with class teachers and year leads.

We also send weekly Newsletter updates to parents/carers detailing forthcoming events.



<u>School council</u>

Our School council is made up of representatives from each of our 9 classes. Children write a letter to their class, explaining why they would make a good school council representative! Class members then take part in a class vote and appointed members receive a School Council Badge, presented by our Assistant Head Teacher Mrs. Mason.

Meetings are held every half term and the council make decisions on ways to improve our school through children's eyes. Mrs. Mason provides and agenda and minutes to all meetings. The school council representatives are an important part of the decision making process at school!



School council liaised with an external company to design and build a new bike storage unit on the field. They even chose the colours they wanted!



Christmas Post office workers

Every year Mrs. Kenny advertises for her Christmas Postal workers to help sort and deliver the school post.

Children complete application forms and provide two references before they are considered for the position. We usually receive applications from all Year 2 children and the hard work begins as soon as December arrives!

Uniforms are provided and Mrs. Kenny expects all workers to be hardworking, sensible and have a good sense of direction. She also expects workers to be able to work independently and to be polite as they deliver Christmas post to each class.





Pastoral Care

- Your child's welfare is of paramount importance. We want your child to be happy and receive the best possible education and care at our school.
- We have a senior member of staff, Mrs. Mason responsible for overseeing all aspects of pastoral care throughout school and we have a Learning Mentor available throughout the day, including lunchtimes, to support with TLC!
- Our wellbeing team meet every month and identify children who may require extra support at school.
- Our Nest nurture groups, Lego clubs, Fun Friends, Drawing for Talking clubs and Emotional literacy sessions all support the wellbeing of our children.
- We have high expectations of our children in all areas of school life
- We promote our school values and expect all children and adults to show respect and care to everyone

• Our Children's mentor (Mrs Long) and our Assistant HT (Mrs Mason) support pastoral care of all children

Extra Curricular activities

- 3. Siblings (still in attendance in September 2025- currently unknown)

4. Distance from school (straight-line measurement)
Cut-off distance 2024 2529m (low birth rate) 37 siblings
Cut-off distance 2023 982m
Cut-off distance 2022 937m Siblings 44



What Parents need to do next:

Apply online to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements from 1st October 2024, you will receive an acknowledgement by email/post. The final closing date for the receipt of applications is 15th January 2025. If acknowledgement is not received phone 0121 303 1888.

Parents can express up to 3 preferences and must rank them in order of preference

Letters/emails allocating places will be sent out by the Local Authority, by email/post 16th April 2025.

Parents/carers must notify the Local Authority by 30th April 2025 if they wish to refuse the place offered. Information on waiting list positions will be available from 7th May 2025.

Fraudulent address will be investigated by the LA and places will be withdrawn.
