Our new Reception Year group in September 2021

We will have 90 places
The children will be placed in 3 parallel classes
Each class will have one full-time teacher and one full-time teaching assistant.



What makes our school special?



- We are an infant and nursery school the age range is only from 3 7 and the school is designed for young children. Our furniture, classrooms, outside areas are all geared towards little people!
- Our children take on responsibility they are school council members, litter monitors, playground buddies, cloakroom monitors, to name but a few!

- Our children move straight to our adjoining federation junior school which they attend from the age of 7 11.

Behaviour

Our Behaviour Strategy is built around our School Values and Rights as members of the Boldmere Community.

We believe that every child has a **right to feel safe**, a **right to learn** and a **right to respect and be respected**. These rights are underpinned by six core values (see image above) that we embrace and uphold at school and in the community.

We use a staged, restorative approach to our behaviour strategy, which allows children time to reflect on choices they make.









Pastoral Care

- Your child's welfare is of paramount importance. We want your child to be happy and receive the best possible education and care at our school.
- We have a senior member of staff, Mrs. Mason, responsible for overseeing all aspects of pastoral care throughout school and we have a Learning Mentor available throughout the day, including lunchtimes, to support with TLC!
- Our wellbeing team meet every fortnight and identify children who may require extra support at school.
- Our Nest nurture groups, Lego clubs and Drawing for Talking clubs support the wellbeing of our children.
- We have high expectations of our children in all areas of school life.
- We promote our school values and expect all children and adults to show respect and care to everyone.




School Grounds

We are lucky to have beautiful school grounds which include two playgrounds and a field (shared with Junior school) as well as a purpose built "Quiet Corner".

Mrs. Long, our Learning Mentor has created a wonderful resource, accessible to all children, in the corner of our Key Stage 1 playground.

With funding help from our fantastic Parent Teacher Association (PTA), Mrs. Long worked with children in Year 2 as well as parent volunteers to clean, sweep,











Home school links.

We know that parents are the first educators of their children and have a fundamental role to play in supporting children's school-based learning. We endeavour, therefore, to build a partnership between home and school that supports the learning and teaching of every child.





Parent workshops on Speech & Language, Reading and Maths allow us to share information about our teaching and offer advice on how parents/carers can support learning at home.

During Covid-19 we have delivered information to parents via slideshow presentations.

Each year group also has a contact email address for parents/carers to communicate with year group staff.

We also send weekly Newsletter updates to parents/carers, detailing forthcoming events.



School council

Our School council is made up of representatives from each of our 9 classes. Children write a letter to their class, explaining why they would make a good school council representative! Class members then take part in a class vote and appointed members receive a School Council Badge, presented by our Assistant Head Teacher Mrs. Mason. Meetings are held every half term and the council make decisions on ways to improve our school (through children's eyes!) Mrs. Mason provides an agenda and minutes to all meetings. The school council representatives are an important part of the decision making process at school!



School council liaised with an external company to design and build a new bike storage unit on the field. They even chose the colours they wanted!



Christmas Post office workers

Every year Mrs. Kenny advertises for her Christmas Postal workers to help sort and deliver the school post.

Children complete application forms and provide two references before they are considered for the position. We usually receive applications from all Year 2 children and the hard work begins as soon as December arrives!

Uniforms are provided and Mrs. Kenny expects all workers to be hardworking, sensible and have a good sense of direction. She also expects workers to be able to work independently and to be polite as they deliver Christmas post to each class.





Resource Base Unit (Boldmere Inclusion Base)

- Children with Autistic spectrum conditions and EHCPs attend the BIB classes.
- The unit was opened in January 2019 and currently has 15 children attending.
- It is linked to Boldmere Infants & Juniors and provides opportunities for children to access mainstream education alongside their BIB provision.
- The BIB also provides support for autism provision within school.

Extra Curricular activities

We have a range of extra-curricular lunchtime activities including football, multiskills, cheerleading, streetdance, tennis, rugby, cricket and musical theatre. Many are provided by external agencies and therefore require payment. Staff also provide lunchtime clubs such as singing, drawing, dance, construction and library.

There is also a before and after-school club, called Busy Bodies open from 8.00am until 6.00pm.

Oversubscription criteria (from BCC admissions)

- 1. Children with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)/Statement of Special Educational Needs naming this school in the ECHP/Statement
- 2. Looked after or previously looked after children (LAC)
- 3. Siblings (still in attendance in September 2021- currently we have 45 siblings)
- 4. Distance from school (straight-line measurement)

What Parents need to do next:

Apply online to the School Admissions and Pupil Placements from 1st October 2020, you will receive an acknowledgement by email/post. The final closing date for the receipt of applications is 15th January 2021. If acknowledgement is not received phone 0121 303 1888.

Parents can express up to 3 preferences and must rank them in order of preference

Letters/emails allocating places will be sent out by the Local Authority, by email/post 16th April 2021.

Parents must return the reply slip to the school by 30th April 2021. If you do not reply, you risk losing the offer.

Fraudulent address will be investigated by the LA and places will be withdrawn.
