Tuesday	Literacy input- explore the front cover of the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' (available on YouTube), including the title, author and illustrator. As you read the story, discuss the different settings the characters explored as part of their adventure, and what they may have seen/heard/felt and smelled along the way. Think about the character of the bear- what was his behaviour like? Why? Do you think he was a friendly bear?  Activity- create a story map to show the sequence of events in the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. You could draw pictures to show the different parts of the story, and label your map using time connectives, e.g. first, next, then, after that, finally.
