#### Parent Representative Meeting

Thank you to our Parent Representatives who attended school last week for our half termly meetings.

We discussed a number of issues that had been raised from our parent questionnaires in March, and also looked at the actions that school has since taken, following the parent feedback. We are pleased to hear that the weekly year group newsletters have been well received and are helping parents/carers to have meaningful conversations with their children about teaching and learning! We have also recognised that there are a few safety issues around school that need to be addressed.

The first of these is around the use of **scooters/bikes in the playground**. Please can we ask that children do not ride scooters/bicycles on the school grounds as there is a real risk of children being hurt in collisions.

We also need to discourage children and parents/carers from accessing the field at the start/end of the day as Busy Bodies children utilise these areas.

Parent Reps also made us aware of an increasing amount of dog excrement on pavements around school.

Failure to pay the penalty notice, will result in the matter proceeding to court and could potentially lead to a criminal record.
