School Meal Prices

The cost of a school dinner is rising to $\pounds 2.40$ from 18th April. Although this is an increase, the daily cost is still cheaper than our previous supplier as they have also increased their prices. The increase is in line with rising food and transport costs for the catering industry.

After-School Sports Clubs

We are really pleased that we are able to have children back doing after-school sports clubs! Starting from this week, we have begun on Spring 2 clubs for each year group that are being run by Kick Start Academy. These clubs will look at covering a range of skills in PE as well as teamwork, but most importantly, we are hoping the children attending have lots of fun! There are still a few remaining spaces for children in Year 5 and 6 so let us know if your child would like to attend this club. Unfortunately, we have not been able to offer places to everyone in lower school but these clubs will continue in the Summer Term.

School Sports Teams

We are also really pleased that we have been able to get our school sports teams up and running again. This week, we have cross-country to look forward to and we have swimming on the horizon too!

Our school football teams are also competing in the HMS Shield. In the last week of last half term, the girls' team were unfortunately knocked out of the HMS Shield as they lost away to Calshot. Our boys' football team won their first round game 7-0 at home to Beeches Primary and will play next in the quarter final vs Calshot away too. More details about this fixture will be sent out soon.

Information for parents and carers on COVID-19 vaccination for 5 to 11 year olds

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI). Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the Green Book.

Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions.

Further information is available in the guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years published by UKHSA. We have published some frequently asked questions on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19. Following advice from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The NHS will prepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all children during April.

Busy Bodies News

<u>After school sports club</u>: Children attending after school sports clubs Monday to Thursday, firstly come to busies to register, we then know that they are in school and attending the club that day for our safeguarding policy.

Different year groups attend each day of the week, this also enables us to prepare a snack for the children on returning to the setting. The sports coach directs all Busies children back to Busy Bodies as he holds the same register of children attending following his session.

<u>March booking forms</u>: Many thanks to all our parents/carers for returning your booking forms, many of you before the deadline and on time. We really appreciate this effort as it saves many hours of following up late forms and the paperwork involved with adding to the registers after they have been printed for the following month.
