## A message from Mr Sadler, Head of Junior School

Dear Parents/ Carers,

The Christmas break is now a dim and distant past and 'normal service' as it were has very much resumed in school. And with regard to normal, much of which I am going to share with you in this week's newsletter concerns the tentative steps we have taken, and are taking, towards that 'normal.' For starters, this week has seen has seen the resumption of hall based assemblies, and although we're not quite bringing the whole school together, that will hopefully come later this half-term, it is definitely a positive step. Additionally, lunchtime arrangements have now taken a decidedly 'normal step', with a shared, whole school lunchtime as per pre-Covid times.
