
Thank you to **Louise Goodhall**, a local lady who kindly donated the wooden Christmas tree and snowman at our BIB entrance.

Child Illnesses

Whilst we obviously encourage positive attendance wherever possible, if children are not well enough to attend school then they should rest at home and return when feeling better. Not only does this allow for the child to recuperate but also, it ensures that illnesses are prevented from spreading more broadly and therefore impacting in school (and on children and families) for longer.

We therefore thought it appropriate to share with you part of the school's first aid and medical needs policy that specifies the absence period expected for different illnesses.

48 Hours

Vomiting/ Diarrhoea – after last symptom of sickness or diarrhoea

Impetigo –until lesions are crusted & healed or 48 hours after

Antibiotic treatment

4 Days from symptoms

- *German Measles
- *Measles

Chicken Pox – until vesicles have crusted over, usually 5 days.

5 Days from symptoms

- *Whooping Cough 5 days from commencing antibiotics
- *Mumps 5 days after onset of swelling

Other

*Scarlet Fever – can return 24 hours after commencing antibiotics

Scabies – after the first treatment

Tonsillitis – until feeling better

Ear infection –until feeling better

Fever – until fever has gone

*Notifiable Diseases

There is a list of notifiable diseases; the school has a duty to keep records of any children who have suffered from any of these illnesses.

Parents may note that there is no specific guidance for Covid therefore it should be interpreted as per the majority of illnesses in the 'other' category - e.g. the child should return when they feel better.
