I am certain by now parents will be aware that Her Majesty will be officially laid to rest next Monday which has consequently been declared a bank holiday. This means that school will be closed to all children and staff and will reopen on Tuesday 20th September. As parents will no doubt expect, we have endeavoured to ensure that the focus in school at the moment is not of sorrow, but more of transition, succession and opportunity; all truly relevant at the start of each new school year. Despite this sad news, the year has otherwise started off in a really positive manner in school with the 'new' cohort of year three children having settled extremely quickly, as have our older children who have moved up to their new year groups. New beginnings for them and also from a staff perspective with our three new teachers, Mrs Quirk, Mrs Shakespeare and Miss Morgan all hitting the ground running within their respective year groups and enjoying their early tenure with us! Finally, to round off this 'new beginnings' thread, I take great pleasure in sharing with you the wonderful news that Mr Uppal, and his partner Miss Sandford, welcomed into the world their daughter Eva late on Sunday night. Congratulations to them both, and also to Mrs Kilday who a few weeks earlier gave birth to baby Alfie at the beginning of the summer holidays. We wish them all well.

Back to school matters and a huge thank you in recognition of the fact that the children collectively look incredibly smart on their return to school. I am delighted to see so many children wearing school ties...so many in fact that we have completely sold out. We have placed an order with the suppliers for a new batch, albeit clip on ties in the expectation that these will be easier for children. We've been given an approximate six week return for these so watch this space.

A reminder that parents of children who eat school meals are strongly encouraged to pre-order these in advance. Admittedly, there have been a couple of issues with the technology associated with this but we believe this has now been resolved. Just to advise, we operate a lunchtime rota with year groups being called for their meals between 12.25pm and 1.00pm, depending on their sitting. In first this week are Year 3, followed by 6, 5 then 4.

Finally from me this week, I am aware that this is a nervy time for a number of our children as they are in the midst of deciding preferences with regard to secondary schools. We will share with you the open days of schools as we learn of them but I would strongly advise that parents of current year six children regularly check the respective school websites to learn of these. The local authority deadline for secondary school preference forms to be completed by is 31st October 2022. Good luck also to a number of our children who will in the next few days will sit the grammar school entrance tests days.

Letters were sent home with your child in July outlining the Birmingham City Council Secondary Transfer process – please note the online site is available now until 31st October for you to make your choices.

If you live outside of Birmingham City Council please check with your Local Authority.

The School Day timings:

A reminder that the school day begins at 8.50 in the morning. Registration closes at 9.00am. Any children arriving after 9.00am will be deemed late. Any children arriving later than 9.30 will see their absence recorded as unauthorised. Frequent unauthorised absence can lead to prosecution.

The school day finishes for all children at 3.25pm. Only in exceptional circumstances will children be permitted to arrive or leave outside of these times.
