Please be aware that we will be sending home populated pupil data forms over the next few weeks for you to review and update the emergency contact details that we keep in school.

Could you please ensure that the forms are checked, amended and returned to school as quickly as possible so we can update our records in case we need to contact you.

Reading Records

Please could all children bring their reading record books into school every day. Our school aim is for children to be reading for a minimum of 15 minutes daily in lower school and a minimum of 20 minutes daily in upper school - some of this will take place in school. Teachers monitor reading record books every week. Please could you sign or make a comment when you hear your child read. We appreciate this is most likely to happen in lower school as children become more independent readers as they progress through school.

Myon - online reading system

As a school, we have paid into an online reading system called Myon, which is linked to Accelerated Reader that we use in school.

You can access it via the following address: https://www.myon.co.uk/

All children have an individual log in (the same as their in-school Accelerated Reader log in) to access further reading material at home. It is particularly good for researching topics that children are interested in, that they are covering in school and for those children that have a love for non-fiction texts. Please encourage your children to access this weekly as all reading counts towards their daily reading time. Most of the books can be 'quizzed on' at home and this will then count to the number of words and books read, for which we hand out certificates termly.
