A message from Mr Sadler, Head of Junior School

Dear parents and carers,

At the time of writing this, I think we have all just about recovered from what was an incredibly fun-packed week that began with children enjoying science week and ended with some of them getting to 'pie-face' their teacher! With regard to science week, children enjoyed numerous activities ranging from exploring aircompression with plastic bottle 'rockets', to building structures out of cocktail sticks and fruit gums capable of withstanding the weight of several books and even some classes exploring the density of fruits, with and without their skin!
