#### A message from Mr Sadler, Head of Junior School

Another incredibly busy week in school this week, a highlight of which definitely includes the maths workshops that we have run, giving parents a flavour of what the maths curriculum looks and feels like here at Boldmere. Following the lower school workshops earlier this year, it was the Year 6 parents that were invited in last Thursday, with the Year 5 parents attending their workshop this morning. As was shared during these sessions, it is an absolute pleasure to be able to host parents in school, particularly so when the emphasis is very much placed on learning and moreover, doing so with their children. Feedback from parents regarding the workshops has been very positive; huge thanks to all staff involved in this, particularly our maths lead Miss Jackson who has led these sessions expertly.

Moving in to this week, something we know many of our children are looking forward to is the Young Voices concert that will be held at Resorts World (NEC) this Wednesday afternoon / evening. This is something the children have been working incredibly hard towards under Miss Brown's guidance during the past couple of months and we wish them all the very best in showcasing their talent: look out for next week's newsletter to hear all about it!

We are well aware that in recent weeks there has been a marked increase in the requests we have made for parental donations; an inevitable consequence of the current financial difficulties faced in schools. A topic discussed in a recent parent representative meeting, and then raised further by another parent last week, is that there will likely be other ways than financial that parents can support the school, in essence offering a 'donation in kind'. It was suggested and recognised that there will be a wealth of skills and interests amongst the parental community in Boldmere that many would be willing to share in support of school improvement. Suggested examples might be parents who are keen 'amateur' photographers who would be prepared to offer their services when we take children's photographs, or others with knowledge / expertise in various trades that could support the enhancing of specific parts of the school environment. In order to try and capture what this 'donation in kind' might look like, below is a link to a short survey whereby parents can share with us examples of any support they would be able to offer. In a joint venture with the infant school, we will audit the responses gathered via this form and at the suggestion of a kind parent, Mr Bennett who is keen to offer his services, seek to form a parent working party to explore this further. It has been a few weeks since this topic has been shared in the newsletter, but I will again issue a plea with regard to keeping our children safe on and around the roads outside of school. In the past week alone, we have had concerns raised by four separate parents/ residents, one that concerned the obstruction of the road and pavement through inconsiderate and illegal parking, a separate concern relating to the speed at which some vehicles are driving along Cofield Road, one regarding a blocked driveway and lastly, regarding a parent using a resident's disabled parking space. As is usually the case, it is a very small minority that are guilty of this but none-the-less, this still presents a significant risk to our children and families. Whilst our 'powers' outside of the school are limited, it is our responsibility to share with you the very real fear we have that someone could be seriously injured in an accident that is truly avoidable if everybody simply did the right thing.

Finally, I would just like to draw your attention to the very important letter shared by Mr Glasgow yesterday afternoon concerning the pending industrial strike action that many teachers are scheduled to participate in , the first of which is planned for Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February. As Mr Glasgow shared in the letter, we will endeavour to give as much notice as possible regarding the specific implications of this action on individual classes and year groups and will update accordingly as the situation develops. As things stand currently, we are expecting a number of classes to be closed as a consequence of this action, and certainly all year groups will be impacted.

#### Spring term parents' evenings:

The dates and details of our spring term parents' evenings were shared via parent mail last Friday and parents have already begun taking the opportunity to book an appointment with their child's teacher. Appointments will be conducted remotely via video call, the details for which are included in the letter shared last week. For the majority of the school, appointments are offered on either Wednesday 8th February or Tuesday 28th February.

Mrs Hannan will be holding parents' evening for parents of children in 4H on either Wednesday 1st February or Wednesday 8th February; slightly differently as a consequence of her upcoming maternity leave.

#### Medication required during the school day

If your child needs to take any medication during the school day this MUST be given by a parent or responsible adult to the School Office and complete a consent form for the medication to be administered by school staff.

Any prescribed medication must be in the original packaging which has a chemist label with your child's name on it.

Non-prescribed medication such as Calpol, cough medicine, Strepsils and eye drops should also be in the original container or box and can be given once a consent form has been completed.

Please **do not** send any medication with your child or in their bags.

#### **Childcare Choices Campaign**

Over a million families in the UK are entitled to support with the costs of childcare from the government, but many are missing out because they do not realise they are eligible. The Childcare Choices campaign aims to raise awareness and understanding of the support available from the government with the costs of childcare. You can support the campaign and help ensure your parents and carers aren't missing out by directing them to <a href="https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk">www.childcarechoices.gov.uk</a> where they can easily find the right offers of childcare support for them.

They could be entitled to:

- up to £2,000 a year of Tax-Free Childcare per child (or £4,000 if disabled) for children up to 11, or 17 if they're disabled
- help with up to 85% of their childcare costs for children up to 16 with Universal Credit
- 30 hours of free childcare for 3- and 4-year-olds if they're a working family in England.

Government childcare financial support is not limited to just nurseries and childminders, depending on eligibility criteria, this support could be used for breakfast clubs, afterschools clubs, activity clubs, holiday clubs, and play schemes.

The Department for Education has also developed a <u>parent toolkit</u> that provides social posts and assets for use on your social media (if applicable) to inform parents and carers of the support available and ensure they aren't missing out.




