A message from Mr Sadler, Head of Junior School

Dear parents and carers,

A particularly wet few days in school saw the disruption to our intended house events last week. Whilst we could not get outside and run the planned sports' events, children did still enjoy a very active week, with instead the focus placed on indoor multi-sports further detail about which is included later in this newsletter. These 'house' themed events will become a regular feature in the Boldmere calendar, with the next round scheduled for the Spring term.

As we approach the end of November, there is a definite hint of the magic of Christmas in the air currently. Our Christmas tree arrived this week and will be contribute to the festive 'look' of the school. The festive look of Boldmere will also be evident at this Friday's Christmas Fair that we look forward to seeing as many children as possible in attendance at. A reminder that the fair will run from 5.00pm – 7.00pm. In terms of the festive 'sound' of the school, our year four children are in the midst of rehearsing (and perfecting) their Christmas performance, ahead of parents and carers being invited in during the last week of term, a parent mail about which was shared recently. Next week will see the festive 'taste and smell' of Christmas in school, with our school Christmas dinner to be served. At the request of Dolce, our catering provider, we have agreed to change the date of Christmas dinner to Thursday 8th December. This will now be the date for both infants and juniors and is reflected on the school grid menu.

Continuing on the theme of Christmas, I would just like to share an important but sensitive message. The cost of living crisis is something that none of us can escape at the moment, evidenced in part by the parental contributions we have requested, and will continue to request, throughout the school year. We recognise for many, myself included, Christmas will be scaled back a little this year as we all feel the pinch. To this end, without wishing to sound in any way presumptuous, there is absolutely no expectation whatsoever for children to feel obliged or pressured into to buying gifts for school staff. From one sensitive message to another equally, if not even more important one. Just as is the case with adults, children will, on occasions, have fall-outs and disagreements. Whilst I understand that for parents it can be concerning to see and hear your child upset or aggrieved, any emotive reaction to this should be tempered, best done by speaking with school staff directly to learn of or seek a resolution to the issue. Under no circumstances is it ever acceptable for a parent or carer to confront or question another child about perceived issues. Naturally, children could find this intimidating and if anything, such challenge is only likely to escalate rather than resolve any issue. Respect and kindness are two of our core values and it is essential they are modelled at all times by all members of the community. Finally, to finish on a positive note, last week saw our Willersley Castle celebration evening where we took the opportunity to share with parents and carers the vast array of photographs and videos showing just how good a time our year six children had during their residential visit earlier this term. As was explained during the evening and again via ParentMail, we were hoping to make the photographs and short videos available for parents and carers, providing there were no objections. I am pleased to say there were no objections raised on the parent survey therefore these will all be made available, on the caveat they are for **personal use only** and not for sharing on any form of social media. At the suggestion of a parent, it was agreed that the use of a file sharing platform, likely Google Classroom, will be far more efficient than through saving the photos on individual memory sticks and is therefore what we will do. All being well, we will adopt a similar model for other future visits and school trips.

Christmas Post

Our Christmas Postal service will commence on Monday 5th December. What this really means is that we will have a post box near the school office where children can post cards to their friends and staff if they wish to. The post box will be emptied by some of Santa's elves (who just happen to be prefects) every couple of days or so.

Christmas at St Michaels

In a return to pre-Covid traditions, we will again be visiting the Church at St Michaels on the last day of term, Friday 16th December. Whilst there, Reverend Gary will lead a service and children will also sing carols.

Winter Holiday Clubs

Bring it on Brum! is running FREE activity clubs in Birmingham for those aged 4-16 who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals during the school Christmas holiday. The majority of clubs will run for 4 days during the week Monday 19th to Friday 23rd December and a smaller number of clubs will run from Wednesday 28th to Friday 30th December 2022. Each child is eligible to attend a maximum of 4 sessions during the winter school holidays.

Activities include sports and games, arts and crafts, cookery, dance and music. Programmes will vary depending on the type and location of each local club, but every day there will be a nutritious meal served up for **free**!

For the Winter programme families of children eligible for free school meals can book online or take their code to access the holiday activities and food programme. Families can visit www.bringitonbrum.co.uk from **Monday 28th November** to book their children's free places, so they can take part in a local club and enjoy the mix of fun action-packed days and tasty food provided through the programme.

Winter Food Boxes

This winter Bring it on Brum! are working with Morrisons to offer **FREE** recipe food boxes. One food box is available for each eligible household (not one per child). Eligible households must have at least one child or young person eligible for benefits-related free school meals living there.

Families can register for a free winter food box from Wednesday 23d November; registrations will close on Wednesday 30th November 2022 or as soon as all food boxes have been allocated.
