A message from Mr Sadler, Head of Junior School

Dear parents and carers,

Just a brief one from myself this week that will start with a mention of last week's parents' evenings. These can either be raised for our attention via the school office (telephone or email) or better still, via a member of the school's leadership team on the school gate.

Parental survey: Thank you to the many parents and carers who have completed the parental survey shared last week. The survey will close tomorrow morning which gives a small amount of time for any existing surveys to be completed. The outcomes will then be analysed and shared with any associated actions factored in to the school improvement plan.

Parent representative group: The nominated parental representative group will be meeting on Friday morning in school with a focus on school improvement priorities for the year or so ahead. It remains the intention that the parent representative group meet with school leaders on a half-termly basis. A reminder of the current parent representative group is provided later in this newsletter.

Lots to look forward to as we approach that final few weeks of the half-term, not least for many of our Year 6 children and staff who will next week will be swapping their classrooms and homes for a week-long stay at Willersley Castle in Matlock. I look forward to telling you all about it on our return.

The School Day timings

A reminder that the school day begins at 8.50am in the morning. Registration closes at 9.00am. Any children arriving after 9.00am will be deemed late. Any children arriving later than 9.30am will see their absence recorded as unauthorised. Frequent unauthorised absence can lead to prosecution.

The school day finishes for all children at 3.25pm. Only in exceptional circumstances will children be permitted to arrive or leave outside of these times.

Forgotten Items

School dinners must be booked via School Grid in advance, you can book several weeks ahead for convenience.

If you forget to book a meal and do not provide a packed lunch your child will only have a very limited option of a jacket potato or wrap depending on availability. The school is not able to place lunch orders on your behalf, even in emergencies, after 9.30am.
