I am also acutely aware too that many of our children will be representing their respective organisations in parades on Remembrance Sunday: we are very proud of them all, as we are of the parents and family members who are currently in the respective services.

A quick reminder that Friday this week is also the day our school photographer is in to take individual and sibling photographs; almost perfectly timed that we now have the long awaited clip-on school ties available for parents to purchase!

To finish this section of our newsletter, two things to make you aware of next week, the first of which relates to Children In Need on Friday 18th November. We'll be marking the occasion with a 'SPOTacular' non-uniform day in school, embracing the 'spotty' theme of this year's event. Donations for Children in Need will be collected in school on the day. Also next week is the 'Big School Swim' where the importance of school swimming is recognised and celebrated – thanks to the mum of Jessica in Year 5 for bringing this to my attention. The event was last held in 2019 where 370 schools across the country participated in the event. We'll be one of a hopefully even bigger number this year, courtesy of the fact that we continue to offer swimming provision for our children. A message from Mr Glasgow - School funding petition

You may have seen in the media recently that as with other areas of public spending, school budgets are currently under the microscope due to significant cuts that will impact drastically on children's learning. Even this morning, the headline report on the BBC news homepage was on this exact topic. As many parents may be aware, conversations about cuts in school funding are currently taking place in the media. All schools are facing difficult decisions around funding, and Boldmere is no different. During meetings with our Parent class representatives last term, the Heads of the Junior and Infant schools discussed the current funding situations in schools and how Boldmere are trying to ensure that curriculum enrichment activities continue to take place across school. We advised the parent representatives that school will be seeking PTA funding as well as parents/carers financial support for certain activities such as cooking ingredients or visiting theatre groups. We thank you in advance for your continued support.

BUSY BODIES

A huge thank you to all our families who have handed in their booking forms on time. This makes it much more manageable to keep our registers up to date and ensure that our children remain safe and looked after within our setting.

If you have not already completed your payments for November, please do so by the end of this week being Friday 11th November. We will be sending out payment reminders throughout this week, please do not hesitate in contacting the Busy Bodies Manager should you require further information about you children's fees.

<u>Support with childcare cost</u> - With the recent raises in the cost of living, there is no doubt that childcare costs may also one of your higher outgoings. <u>Did you know that you might be entitled to extra funding to help with your childcare cost?</u>

The Government Tax-Free Childcare scheme could help working parents or carers get up to £500 every three months (up to £2,000 a year per child) or if their child has a disability, they can get up to £1,000 every three months (up to £4,000 a year per child) to help with the costs of childcare.

Parents can use the money to pay for before and after school clubs, holiday clubs and play schemes as well as Nursery, Childminder or Nanny fees.

If you get Tax-Free Childcare, you will set up an online childcare account for your child. For every £8 you pay into this account, the government will pay in £2 (that a massive 20% towards your childcare outgoings) to use to pay your provider.
