Dear Parents / Carers,

We have already had a great start to the new year and the children have begun to settle really well into their new classes and school life.

We have been working really hard to raise the profile of our values and to produce a consistent approach to behaviour across the two schools which is: fair, sets clear boundaries and expectations, develops children's awareness of behaviour and provides strategies for all pupils to grow and develop.

We are very aware that the best learning comes when communities work together and this is where we would like your help! We have sent home a home school agreement for you to read with your children, this should be signed and sent back into school as soon as possible. In the booklet we have included the class rules that your children have written with their teacher as part of their transition work.

The new behaviour strategy is briefly outlined for you; your children should be able to explain this to you further.

## We want to communicate with you!

- We are currently creating a behaviour area on the website where you will be able to see who our weekly Values Ambassadors are, read our reviewed behaviour policy and see the stages linking to the behaviour strategy. A copy of the home school agreement will also be on there.
- We will also send you a thank you text every half term if your child has shown expected behaviour and not been placed on the stages tracking system - this is our way of celebrating children who are doing the right thing all (or nearly) all of the time.

- We will contact you if we have any concerns about behaviour or if your child is placed on stage 3, this will help us work together to support your child.
- We will also have class points (Infants) and house points (Juniors) which will be given for outstanding - above and beyond - work or effort, to help children recognise their achievements within the classroom and around the school. Once the children get to 50, 100 and 200 points they will receive a certificate home letting you know just how amazing they are!
- We are also looking forward to offering a few joint parent workshops for any parents who would like to know more about our approach in the near future.
