

Stages of Behaviour

	What is it?	What happens?	Next Steps
Expected	Everyone starts at expected. We expect everyone in our school to follow the school rights and values.	Thank You: Every half term we will send a text to your parents / carers to thank you and celebrate your efforts with your behaviour. Values Ambassadors: We will be on the lookout for our very best ambassadors! Every week one child from each class will be nominated and awarded as an ambassador. You will be celebrated in our assembly and will wear our ambassadors badges for the week until you can pass them on to the next ambassadors.	Keep going – you're a star!
Reminder	Your teacher is reminding you to be your very best.	If you have a reminder, think about our rights and rules. Decide to make a change now to get back on track.	You can work your way back to expected!
Stage 1	You had a reminder but you are still doing	Your teacher will tell you what you are doing and what they would like to see. You have the chance to change your behaviour.	You can work your way back to expected!
A chance to change	something that is disrupting the learning. This is your chance to make a change.	You own your behaviour and are in control of how to make it the best – if you need help with this, ask your teacher to help you. Your behaviour will be recorded.	If you get onto stage 1 or 2 more than three times in a week we will contact your parents to discuss how we can work together to get you back on track.
Stage 2	Your behaviour hasn't got better or you are	Your teacher will talk to you about stopping this now. You may be moved within the classroom to somewhere you can focus.

Stage 3	Your behaviour has not improved or is unacceptable	You may be sent to your partner classes if your behaviour is very disruptive to the lesson and learning.	You can make a fresh start tomorrow.
