

What has been the impact of the 2019-20 Pupil Premium?

1. Infant School

Performance of disadvantaged pupils 2019-20

Reception – EYFS

14% (13 children) of the cohort were in receipt of Pupil Premium

8% of the pupil premium pupils were receiving SEN support.

31% (4 children) of pupil premium pupils were predicted to meet the expected standard (ie a Good Level of Development) at the end of Foundation Stage in July 2020, based on March outcomes (due to Covid -19 pandemic, children were not in school and EYFS profile was not statutory).

National data for EYFS for 2020 was not available due to Covid-19.

Year 1 phonics:

16% of the cohort were in receipt of Pupil Premium

7% (1 child) of the pupil premium pupils were receiving SEN support.

64% (9 children) of pupil premium pupils were predicted to meet the expected standard (ie 32/40) in the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check taken during July 2020 (due to Covid-19 this was not completed in July).

National other for 2020 was not available due to Covid-19.

End of Key Stage One:

8% of the cohort were in receipt of Pupil Premium

29% of the pupil premium pupils were receiving SEN support.

71% of pupil premium children were predicted to meet the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 1 in Reading in July 2020.

43% of pupil premium children were predicted to meet the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 1 in Writing in July 2020.

71% of pupil premium children were predicted to meet the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 1 in Maths in July 2020.

National data for Key Stage 1 for 2020 was not available due to Covid-19.
