#### Punctuality And Attendance

We would like to remind parents/carers of the impact that punctuality, as well as good attendance, has on your child's learning. Each week, we celebrate the class with highest attendance however punctuality is something that we do not usually need reminders of. Unfortunately, we are seeing an increasing number of children arriving late, and on regular occasions. Teaching and learning begins the moment children walk into school, and when children are brought after 9.00am, vital opportunities are being missed. To give some context, Year 2 re-cap the previous days' learning, Year 1 introduce new phonic sounds, and Reception begin "funky fingers" activities to develop fine motor control. If your child regularly arrives at 9.10, they will have missed one hour of teaching during the course of just one week. Our expectation is that children arrive at school between 8.50 and 9.00 am every day. Please can we urge parents/carers to support their child's learning by arriving at school on time.
