Governors recently enjoyed a visit to the school which had a focus on reading and well-being. Classroom visits were undertaken where Governors were able to look at the reading resources allocated to children, the development of the teaching of reading from nursery up to Year 6 and finally, the adopted phonics scheme being put into practice. Governors also had the pleasure of listening to children from each year group read. It was an invaluable visit and really helped to understand how this area is being developed and prioritised throughout the school. It was also a joy to see all the children enjoying their reading. Thank you to all the staff for making us feel so welcome.



## Finance Committee from Dan Mortiboys, Chair.

It is true to say COVID 19 created financial challenges for the school. These challenges were not only felt when dealing with the pandemic but also during a period of recovery. With the wonderful support of the PTA and strong financial management the schools were able to exit the pandemic with a stable financial position.

The schools were able to make some carefully considered investment in 2021. This included additional IT, some additional staff to support recovery and most excitingly a refresh of the nursery equipment. This is beyond the help received from government.

Unfortunately, while the schools hoped for further stability they are now having to cope with the cost of living crisis the same as everywhere else. The funding the school receives from central government via Birmingham City Council was agreed late last year. There has been no additional funding for the school to cope with the pressure of energy costs and inflation. While the schools can deal with this in the short because of the careful planning that has been undertaken, the 'rainy day' monies will be quickly exhausted. The governing body is undertaking additional finance meetings to ensure every opportunity is taken and that the school has a realistic plan going forwards.

Even more than usual the school is particularly grateful to the massive contribution of the PTA and their work to get those 'extra' things the schools need.

## **Education and Standards Committee from Nicola Arkinstall, Chair.**

The Education Committee have continued to focus on ensuring that every child receives the best possible quality of education.

Within our meetings we look at and discuss:

Head of School Reports, which give us a wealth of information about teaching and learning within the school

We analyse data to look at the progress of all the pupils

We look at attendance data and actions to support all pupils to have good attendance

We talk about the curriculum and all the fantastic opportunities that are given to ensure the pupils receive a rich, broad and balanced curriculum

- We monitor the School Improvement plan and review the progress of the actions to meet the targets
- We discuss the Inclusion Base and receive and update on its development
- We review expenditure of the Pupil Premium and Sports Premium funding
- We discuss staff and pupil mental health and wellbeing
- We also review and approve policies related to education and standards

We carry out regular school visits which focus on a particular aspect for each visit. The last school visit, which took place in March, focused on how we are supporting all the pupils with their mental health and wellbeing. The school visits give the Governors an opportunity to see everything that we discuss in the meetings taking place in the day to day lives of the pupils. We also have the opportunity to talk to all the staff and sometimes receive presentations from curriculum leaders to update us on their subject areas.

### **Parent Representative Groups Update**
