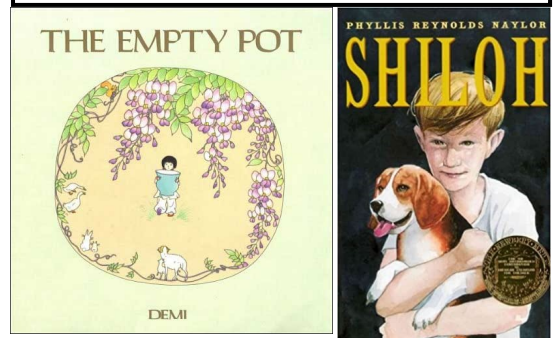
At school:

At home:

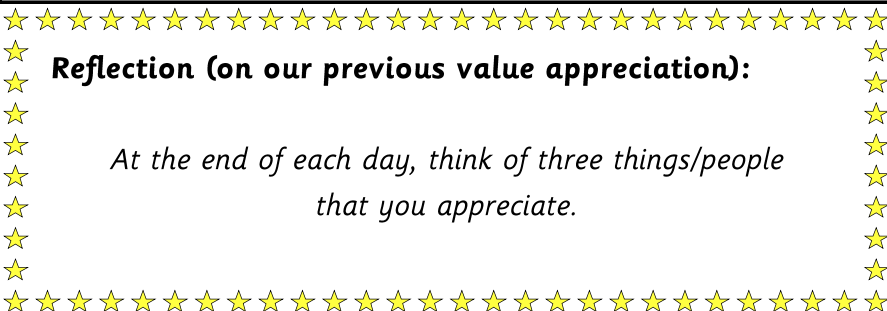
