Performance of disadvantaged pupils 2018-19

Reception – EYFS

12% of the cohort were in receipt of Pupil Premium

18% of the pupil premium pupils were receiving SEN support.

64% of pupil premium pupils met the expected standard (ie a Good Level of Development) at the end of Foundation Stage in July 2019.

National other for 2019 was 71.8%

Year 1 phonics:

7.6% of the cohort were in receipt of Pupil Premium

43% of the pupil premium pupils were receiving SEN support.

57% of pupil premium pupils met the expected standard (ie 32/40) in the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check in July 2019.

National other for 2019 was 82%

End of Key Stage One:

9.7% of the cohort were in receipt of Pupil Premium

44% of the pupil premium pupils were receiving SEN support.

67% of pupil premium children met the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 1 in Reading in July 2019.

44% of pupil premium children met the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 1 in Writing in July 2019.

78% of pupil premium children met the expected standard at the end of Key Stage 1 in Maths in July 2019.
