School Catering update

Parents and carers will be aware of the communication shared last week following the recent visit of the environmental health officer and the subsequent downgrading of the schools' food standards agency rating. In that communication, it was shared that the school were expecting an imminent re-visit to check that the areas of concern identified during the inspection have subsequently been remedied. We are pleased to share that the re-visit took place on Friday 16th January. The environmental health officer identified that the vast majority of issues had indeed been remedied and significant improvements had been made. We have now been advised to book a re-assessment within a four week window in order for the rating to be re-evaluated (with the expectation that this return to a grade 4 and 5).

In the meantime, the school continues to explore further its options relating to its catering provision and we expect to advise parents and carers of the outcome of this exploration later this term.

Medical Appointments

Absences

An important reminder about absence requests and penalty notices for unauthorised absences.

The Education Legal Intervention Team have notified school that they have now begun to issue penalty notices (fines) for unauthorised absences.

Please note that fines are issued to **BOTH PARENTS** and **BOTH PARENTS** must pay the penalties.

Failure to pay the penalty notice, will result in the matter proceeding to court and could potentially lead to a criminal record.

Nursery Open Day for September 2026 Intake

Please don't worry if you missed last week's opportunity for children to get their challenges signed. Below are the dates for when children can bring their books into school next.




