Dear Parents/Carers

Cold Weather

I hope that everyone is keeping warm during this recent cold weather. I am pleased to see that children are coming to school all wrapped up with coats, hats, gloves and scarves- some of you are even remembering to name all items so thank you! We are continuing to have our normal playtimes but have been bringing the children in a little early from lunchtime play when necessary.

I am aware that some children do suffer with asthma, eczema and dry skin conditions when the winter is upon us and we ask that parents contact the school should they have additional medicines that might be required for their child/children. Please can we remind parents/carers however, that lip gloss items are not permitted at school and should lip balms be required for your child, you must speak with the class teacher and notify us prior to items being brought into school. Please also reiterate to your child/ children that they must never share any lip balms medications. A final word this week is in relation to Measles. As you may have seen, the BBC National news this week has reported on the current escalation of measles across the country, but specifically in Birmingham. We notified parents of this information in a Parentmail last week, but would like to stress the importance of Birmingham recommendations. School are attending a webinar from the Health Protection Team on Thursday which will update educational settings with the latest news and guidance, and we will share this as necessary. In the meantime, we are attaching the Parentmail information again to today's newsletter.

School Monitoring

Our monitoring this term continues to be around effective reading and writing as well as Ofsted action points regarding behaviour expectations and the consistency of rewards across school. Mrs Beesley has been particularly impressed with reading progress since September and phonic assessments have shown how well children are achieving from their starting points. Well done everyone! We cannot stress the importance of reading so please continue to work with your child each day - sharing stories, talking about pictures and practising their reading books with them. Thank you for your continued support.
