

Dear Parents/Carers,

The last leg of this academic year has started with excitement as we participate in our **Science week** activities! Today Y1, Y2 and BIB classes have also had a visit from Laura at **The Animal Man Company** and children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about lots of animal groups. They have cuddled a honey bear called Esther (Esther in 1M was very keen to tell me this!), and Samuel also explained how the snake had been sitting on his shoulders around his neck! Laura has also reported that we have polite and well behaved children at Boldmere and she has felt very welcomed into our school by all staff. Reception children will have additional "stay & play" sessions week beginning 30th June and details will be provided during the Induction meeting this week.

Our main **transition day** for the rest of school will be **Wednesday 2nd July** where children will spend the day in their new classroom with their new teachers. Further information will be sent in due course but please rest assured that we have an exciting day planned and we encourage children to see the day as a positive experience. Additional transition activities also take place for those children who may require a little more support with changes. We ask that as parents and carers, you also send positive messages to your children and encourage excitement and awe! **Transition meetings for SEND children Y2-Y3** will be taking place during **7th and 8th July** and parents will be allocated specific time slots for these meetings. Mrs Jones will be sending letters with this information next week.

If we have not heard from you then a call will be made to you as part of our responsibility to safeguard children. Thank you.


Absences

We look forward to meeting all of our new families.






