<u>Links to Year 2 activities on Twinkl</u>

The website Twinkl is offering a month free for parents so that you can access home learning resources. On the website, they have numerous resources for different subjects and year groups. It can be quite overwhelming, so below we have linked some Year 2 based activities for maths, reading and writing. The website also offers a daily timetable with other suggested activities/ printouts. If you do not have access to a printer at home then they can provide you with ideas to create your own activities/ worksheets.

<u>Reading</u>

Comprehension activities

<u>Fiction</u>

Read the story 'A Monster Surprise' – a fun fiction adventure about making friends. Can you answer the questions based on what you have read? The comprehension includes three differentiated levels of questions (inference and retrieval)– select the questions you feel are most suitable for your child.

<u>Challenge</u>: Can you think of your own comprehension questions about the story to ask a grown-up or a family member? Check to see if they have been listening carefully to your reading!

<u>60 Second Reads</u>

At the end of year 2, the expected reading word count within one minute for a year 2 child is 90 words. Pick a 60 second read sheet and have a go. How many words can your child read in one minute?

Have a go at asking the questions that come with each extract – have they understood what they have read?

There are lots to choose from, so you could have a go at one each week and keep a track of your child's word count to see how they make progress.

<u>Maths</u>

Multiplication – 2, 5 and 10.

Activity challenge cards to support and consolidate counting in 2s, 5s and 10s. Can you solve the problems and answer the question prompt questions?

<u>Challenge</u>: Can you practically sort objects into groups of 2, 5 and 10 and count in those multiples? – e.g. 5p coins, pairs of socks.


Try writing your 2, 5 and 10 times tables as a number sentence $-e.g. 3 \times 5 = 15$ and practise your rapid recall of these multiplication facts.

You could show your working out in a book you have or your exercise book you took home from school, just like in your maths jotter.


Remember that when you are adding and subtracting, you will need to show your working out by drawing your own pictures (counters, tens and ones) Here is an example to remind you.
