Dear Parents/Carers.

Our newsletter this week starts with the feedback from our parent survey. A huge thank you to all parents/carers who provided feedback in advance of the 10^{th} March deadline. I am pleased to have collated the information, and the findings are attached to today's newsletter. I have worked with Mrs Mason and Mrs Beesley to analyse the feedback and we are pleased to inform you that many of the suggestions made have already been acted upon. The two attached documents details results and the actions we are taking in response to your feedback, but also includes some of the lovely comments that you have made!

Thank you again for your continued support and for providing a critical friend when evaluating our school effectiveness. I am pleased to say however that from the 158 responses, 99% said their child was happy at school , 99 % that their child was doing well at school, and 99% would recommend us to other parents.

As many of you may be aware, we have a number of illnesses circulating school currently. Many children are poorly with temperatures and sickness and staff are also being affected too. I have received two emails from parents concerned about our school policies around illness, so would like to clarify our position. These decisions are based on NHS recommendations (https://assets.publishing.service.gov.uk/media/626669cb8fa8f523b7221b98/UKHSA-should-I-keep-my_child_off_school_quidance-A3-poster.pdf) and are to protect your children and to prevent illnesses spreading in class and across school.

If your child has sickness or diarrhoea, then they must be at home for a minimum of 48 hours. Where your child has a temperature that is requiring calpol/other pain relief to control then they should not be at school until the temperature has reduced. Staff take great care in monitoring children where they present as being "out of sorts" or where a child tells us that they feel unwell. Where we have concerns that a child is poorly and needs to be at home, we will call parents/carers to discuss and agree to an early collection. Where a child is sick on the school premises, they will be sent home immediately and guidelines above must be followed. Obviously, our children are of an age where illnesses can take hold very quickly and temperatures can rise and fall but please be reassured that we will always make calls to parents where we are concerned about your child's health. Thank you for your support in this matter.

ED are learning about St Patrick's Day. They are tasting Irish soda bread and potato printing. In Literacy they are continuing with traditional stories and in Maths, capacity.


