### Dear Parents/Carers,

My first words in today's newsletter are aimed primarily at Y2 children and families. Due to technical issues yesterday with Parentmail, there has been a delay in our correspondence regarding the Y2 trip to the Black Country Living Museum. As you are probably now aware, payments made for the trip were refunded yesterday as the trip has been cancelled. This is obviously hugely disappointing for staff and children and the decision has not been taken without considerable thought. The deadline for payment was this Wednesday and as of yesterday, we were £440 short of meeting the costs for transport and entrance fee. School were required to pay a non-refundable deposit to the museum yesterday. In previous years we have done this, despite having insufficient funds from parents at this point. School is currently having to make difficult decisions regarding our financial expenditure and as a result, cannot justify this spending. We simply cannot pay money out in advance of "hoping" that parent contributions will cover costs.

Although many parents had made their payments, a number had not done so, or had only partially paid, despite reminders last week. There has been some discussion around the use of the term "voluntary contribution" and we perhaps need to explain further.

Educational visits are not a compulsory part of the National Curriculum, they are simply an excellent way to teach it, and the value of educational visits cannot be underestimated. School endeavours to keep educational costs to a minimum and only passes on to parents the charges incurred. Parents are only asked to cover the costs of their child and are never asked to subsidise other children. However, we perhaps need to stress that without parents paying the full amount requested, the trips cannot take place. School cannot subsidise these financial payments. As ever though, if you are having difficulty in meeting the financial contributions requested, please contact school to discuss ways that we may be able to support.

Our first week back after Easter will be an exciting one, culminating in an Eid party day on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> April. We are having Bhangra workshops for all children, including all BIB classes, on 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> and children will receive a party bag to decorate and return with party food for their Eid celebrations on 12<sup>th</sup>. We have requested a £3.00 parental contribution for the workshops, payable on Parentpay as soon as possible please.

We would like to inform everyone that morning access to the school site after Easter will be changing slightly, in response to safeguarding issues raised across the Federation. The main gates between the two schools will remained closed until 8:40am each day. Please can we remind parents/carers that children attending Infant school are the responsibility of parents/carers until the child is welcomed through the school door, and into class. Children should be accompanied to the doors by their responsible adult.

On a final note, it is with a heavy heart that we say goodbye to Mrs. McDonald at the end of this week. Mrs. McDonald is retiring from Boldmere after 20 years of service. She has been a huge inspiration to many staff and children, and her knowledge of Early Years Education (in particular outdoor provision and learning!) cannot be matched! Although we will miss her terribly, we wish her luck with her retirement and would like to say a big thank you for the service that she has given to Boldmere.

# Behaviour Approach- Positive Reinforcements

We have recently been reviewing and refining the positive reinforcements that we use as part of the school behaviour approach. Our children are motivated by praise and we want to ensure fairness and consistency. We want to ensure that praise is meaningful and that it acknowledges and reinforces behaviours which are within children's control, and supports pupils to understand how their actions have led to success.

After gathering views from children, parents/ carers and staff, we have made some amendments to the 'Positive Reinforcements' section of the Behaviour Policy. Please see below how praise and positive reinforcements are implemented at Boldmere Infant and Nursery School.

- · Adults offer verbal praise to raise behavioural awareness.
- A visit to the Head of School's office to receive a Head Teacher's or Assistant Head Teacher's sticker to celebrate hard work and effort.
- Every week a child from each class is recognised for good behaviour, attitude and achievement. They are then celebrated during Celebration Assembly.
- 'Team Tokens' are awarded to children who are modelling the school values. The tokens are put into year group tubes. When a year group fills their tube they are awarded with a treat, for example, time on the bikes and bike track, or extra golden time
- Class points (monster points) are awarded to children for individual effort, contribution and hard work. Children receive a bronze certificate when they have earned 10 class points, a silver certificate when they have earned 20 and a gold certificate signed by Head of School when they reach 30 points.
  - Throughout the school year all children will have the opportunity to attend a 'Tea Party' with the Head of school to celebrate their achievements and contribute to pupil voice.
