Chickenpox

We currently have a number of children in all year groups who have chickenpox. Symptoms include a fever, runny nose, cough and general rash which starts as blisters and then forms a scab. Chickenpox is very infectious and is spread by the respiratory route through discharges from the nose and throat but sometimes through direct contact with the rash. The incubation period of chickenpox is 2-3 weeks and the person is infectious for 1-2 days before and 5 days after the appearance of the rash. Please contact school if your child has chickenpox, and keep your child at home for 5 days after the rash has appeared.



COVID - Living with Covid


As you aware, the Government have stated that we are entering the 'living with Covid 19' phase. For the time being; staff and children who have symptoms of the virus are encouraged to undertake a confirmatory PCR test if possible and still advised to self-isolate for a minimum of 5 days and expected maximum of 10 days

Information for parents and carers on COVID-19 vaccination for 5 to 11 year olds

Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI). Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) in the Green Book. Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions. Further information is available in the guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years published by UKHSA. We have published some frequently asked questions on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19. Following advice from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. Methods of Payment via ParentPay

Due to the success of our lunchtime clubs, we are regularly oversubscribed for places. We try to refund parents their money as soon as possible but often this can be very delayed due to funds not being available because of the method of payment used by parents.

To clarify so that parents can make their own informed decisions:

If using the bank transfer method of payment - it can take 3-5 working days and sometimes up to 10 days for the funds to be cleared by the bank before school can access the money to make refunds.

If parents scroll further down the payment page to checkout and choose either visa checkout or pay - use another method and then put/save your card details, the money is then cleared immediately so that if necessary school can refund as soon as we are able to.

This applies to all payments made via ParentPay. We hope this helps explain things a little more clearly.
