

#### Dear Parents/Carers.

This week I would like to start by referencing our colleagues at Junior school and the fabulous Y6 children who are sitting their SATs this week. Many of you may be aware that we have a statutory obligation to deliver certain tests and assessments throughout a child's time in primary school. In Reception, we assess children using the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile, in Year 1 our children sit a phonic screening check, in Y4 there are multiplication tests and finally in Y6 there are SATs. Whilst we know that some children may find the pressures of sitting tests/exams a little challenging or daunting, I can reassure you that we approach these procedures with a calm and positive attitude and we know that the children always do their best. In the grand scheme of things, and with an aging head on my shoulders, I can reassure all parents and children that test results are never the be all and end all of life -there are far more important things to focus on that help us become successes in the world.

Today our Y2 children have visited Aston Villa and had an amazing morning participating in sports activities. The children behaved impeccably and Amber was super impressed with our listening skills. Thanks to Amber for organising the event, we always get so much out of these extra-curricular activities and thoroughly enjoyed the morning. Amber will be supporting us at our Sports Day event next Thursday and we look forward to seeing parents/carers during the afternoon. The races will start at 1.30pm. Please access the field via the big green gates between Infant and Junior school. Should the event finish before the end of school, children will be allowed to leave early with parents/carers. All PE kits will be sent home on Wednesday and children should attend school on Thursday wearing their PE kit rather than school uniform. The day is weather dependent though so please keep an eye on school messages if the forecast looks rainy! This week, as part of our ongoing monitoring, we are welcoming our Governors into school to talk about our curriculum provision, specifically the teaching and learning in Foundation subjects. Staff will be sharing our timetables, curriculum overviews, planning and book evidence in order to provide information about the breadth of our curriculum offer. We look forward to their visit and will feed back their thoughts following the day.
