

Dear Parents/Carers.

We have started the week with great excitement as **Reception** attended **Ash End Farm** yesterday! I am ending on a rather sad and distressing note this week. Our school grounds, in particular the Nursery outdoor area, are being vandalised and defaced during the evenings and weekends. Mr Meakin is regularly finding dog excrement thrown over the fence into the Nursery playground, as well as toys being moved and broken, gates being unlocked and access gained to Reception playground. I urge all parents/carers to contact the Police on 101 if they see or hear anything suspicious around school or the local area.

Informing school of inappropriate behaviour is not enough to hold these youths to account and only by reporting this antisocial behaviour to the Police, will action be taken. Once reports have been made, please contact school with a crime reference number and this can then be logged on school systems.

Keeping our school, our children and the local community safe is paramount and we can only do this by being vigilant and working together to report these incidents.

Failure to pay the penalty notice, will result in the matter proceeding to court and could potentially lead to a criminal record.

#### Arbor log-in

Last week we launched the new Arbor app for parents, we hope that all our families have been able to log on successfully. We are aware of a few issues, which we have worked hard to rectify for our families. If you are still having trouble accessing your child's profile, kindly contact the Busy Bodies Manager.

Please note that we are requesting that parents continue to book on a monthly basis unless you work shift patterns, and need to do weekly bookings. This will support us to ensure appropriate staff to children ratio at all times.

You are able to make bookings up until the end of this academic year.

Once sessions are booked, please note that these are only refundable based on our charging policy. We understand that for the first month or so, adjustment may need to be made as parents get used to the system. Should this be the case, kindly send us and email and we will manually make these changes for you.


## Celebrations (for week beginning 12th May)

Literacy I continues to focus on the story 'What the Ladybird heard,' by Julia Donaldson.


The children are being encouraged to repeat words and phrases they hear in the story.
