We are delighted to have been able to recruit Mrs Preece and she joins us from her current role as lead professional of the Communication and Autism Team (CAT) for Birmingham Local Authority. ## Covid-19 Information

We are still seeing a rise in cases in school and continue to work with public health in regards to this.

We are liaising with PHE and DfE regarding the outbreak and will keep parents updated regularly with parentmails.

# Reminder Regarding COVID-19.

If your child displays any COVID-19 symptoms, they must have a PCR test and isolate at home until the results are received.

If results are negative, your child may return to school if they are well enough to do so.

If results are positive, your child must isolate for 10 days from the onset of symptoms or the test date.

If your child is taking a PCR test as they have been identified as a possible close contact, they can attend school as long as they have no COVID-19 symptoms.

Lateral flow testing should be used for asymptomatic testing. If your child has any COVID-19 symptoms, they must book a PCR test.

Please ensure you let the school office know, in advance, if you book a PCR test for your child and advise the office of the result of the test before your child returns to school.

<u>REMINDER</u>: If you are communicating with the school regarding your child's absence or regarding a PCR test result, please email through to 'enquiry@boldmere.bham.sch.uk' and <u>NOT</u> the year group email address. Please indicate in the heading of the email your child's class. Thank you.

FSM – if your child is absent due to covid and is eligible for free school meals please contact the school office regardign support/information.

# Google Classroom

Google Classroom is the digital online platform for children that are self-isolating due to a positive Covid-19 test result.

When school receives notice from a parent/carer that the child has received a positive PCR test result, the child will be given access to the Google Classroom page. If the child is ill, there is no expectation for work to be completed, but if the child is well then work can be accessed, completed and sent in for the teacher to see. On the Google Classroom page, the child will find work that is in line with what is being taught in school.
