the end of the day, we request that you allow your child to enter their classes' zone and to be sent off by their teacher. This is a safeguarding requirement to allow our staff to ensure all children have been sent off to the correct adult.

As this area is narrow please ensure you vacate the area quickly in order to avoid congestion at the end of the day.

ParentPay - Username and Password

Information regarding ParentPay, including usernames/passwords were sent out yesterday to parents/carers of year 3 children and any other new children in school. If you have not yet received this information, please advise the school office.

Collecting children from school

Our school is a large school and our priority is to keep all children safe. At the end of the day children in years 3 and 4 are handed over to parents/carers at designated places. If you ask someone who does not normally collect your child, please tell the class teacher/school office, as we will obviously not let children leave with strangers. Unless we are given specific written authorisation, we will not let children leave the school in the care of any other child under the age of 16. We would appreciate any parents who have custody issues relating to the collection of their children, to speak either to class teachers or to the school office.

Contact details:

It is essential that parents/carers inform us immediately whenever mobile telephone numbers or any other contact details change. We must be able to contact a parent/carer at all times. Coloured contact cards will be sent out via children in years 4, 5 and 6 shortly.

Car Parking outside of the school

We appreciate the difficulty created by limited parking space for parents who need to drive to school to collect children. As ever, our only concern is for the safety of the children. Could we therefore ask parents not to park in the zig-zag safety area directly outside of the school. We would also remind our parents of the importance of parking safely and be considerate to residents when parking to drop off and collect your child from school.

Medical Conditions and Allergies

If our child has an on-going medical condition, such as asthma or an allergy, please ensure that the school is aware of the condition and is in receipt of any prescribed medication. Asthma Inhalers are kept in the classroom and all other medication is kept in the school office. Please ensure that medication is in date and replenished when needed, it is parents/carers responsibility to do so. Children with long term medical conditions will have a care plan, which will be reviewed annually.

e-safety reminder

Ensuring that children are safe when using information technology is an essential life skill and is needed more now than ever with children having increased screen time and access to the internet.

We do have some children who have allergies to nuts and nut products. Please note that we do not allow nuts for snacks or lunches as this can trigger the allergy in other children.

Clothes/other property labelling

Please ensure that your child's clothes, including coats, school uniform and PE kit are labelled. We also ask that you provide your child with a water bottle in school (also labelled), for them to drink from. They are able to refill their bottle in school.
