#### Re-opening For Nursery, Reception And Year 6

Requests for Nursery, Reception and Year 6 provision have all been accepted. Maximum class sizes to ensure we are operational have been reached. Numbers are now capped to ensure we can meet safety requirements in each class "bubble", whilst also maintaining our existing provision previously agreed for keyworkers. Further information will be sent next week to all parents who have requested a school place in these target year groups.

It is particularly good because you have the option to hear the books and new vocabulary is highlighted with a link to an easy online dictionary. Also ...

## Parents/Carers Of Year 5 Children - Reminder

We have been advised that registration for the optional entrance test for admission to the eight Grammar Schools in Birmingham in September 2021 is now open. The deadline for registering for the test is **4pm on Friday 26 June 2020.** 

Parents can find more information about the test and can register their child for the test by visiting www.birminghamgrammarschools.org

Children only need to sit one entrance test to be considered for any of the grammar schools in Birmingham. The entrance test for September 2021 entry will be held on Saturday 12 September 2020 (this may be subject to change depending on the COVID-19 situation).

#### FAO Year 3 parents/guardians (Year 4 in September 2020) - Whitemoor Lake Residential Trip February 2020

A final reminder that if you wish your child to take part in the above residential trip, please make your deposit payment via ParentPay by Friday 29 May 2020. Those children who are eligible for pupil premium funding will have received a separate letter in March giving details. However, those parents/guardians whose child is eligible for pupil premium funding must ensure that the junior school office staff are aware that they wish their child to take part in this residential trip.

#### Music Lessons – Summer Term Payment

For those children who are receiving 1:1 music tuition online, provided by the Music Service, the cost for the summer term will remain at £80, guaranteeing a minimum of 25 lessons during this academic year. If your child has not taken up the offer from the Music Service, you will need to pay £40 for the summer term, as the school are being charged 50% of the cost for this term by the Music Service. Please check your ParentPay account.

We also take this opportunity to remind you that the school requires <u>half a term's notice</u>, in writing, should your child not wish to continue with their lessons at any point during the academic year. Therefore, if your child does not wish to receive music lessons in the Autumn term 2020, please advise the school office by <u>1 June 2020</u>.
