# **General Information**

A positive Covid-19 case with a year 2 child has been confirmed this morning. At the time of writing this newsletter we have spoken to Public Health England and upon our initial discussions and consultation with our Chair of Governors all children in Year 2 will be required to self- isolate for 14 days. The child was in school on Monday 12th October and as a result, all children will have to self-isolate from Monday 12th October to Monday 26th October. Year 2 children can return to school following half term on Monday 2nd November. Any child that was absent from school on 8th, 9th or 12th October will be contacted directly to discuss individual return dates. No other classes or children have been identified as positive contacts.

This is a very unfortunate situation particularly as 2S have only just returned to school. Please rest assured that we are looking again at ways that we can facilitate playtimes and lunchtimes to reduce the contact between class and year group bubbles, and thereby reducing the impact of positive cases.

Please work with school and follow the National and local guidelines. Every week we have given advice but as a school, we feel that this needs a further reminder today; If you, your child or anyone in your household has symptoms or has taken a test you must not allow your child or siblings to attend school.

We have school systems in place to manage any positive cases but we need parents to take some responsibility in keeping all children, staff and members of the community safe. We wish the child in year 2 a speedy recovery.

# **Collection and Drop Off**

Many thanks to everyone who is working with us to social distance, to drop off and pick up at your allotted times and for working together to keep everybody safe. We continue to work on the areas some of you have asked questions about, particularly regarding Year 3 drop off and collection point. Thank you for your support and patience.

## **Delivery of items during the school day - reminder**

A reminder, to help reduce the need for the office staff to deliver items to children in their different class bubbles, please ensure your child brings everything they need with them at the start of the school day, e.g. coats, lunchboxes, water bottles etc. Thank you.

#### Nasal Flu Immunisation – Thursday 26 November 2020

We are writing to advise parents/guardians that NHS Birmingham Community Healthcare Immunisation team will be coming into school on Thursday 26 November to administer the Nasal Flue vaccination to year 3, year 4, year 5 and year 6 children. Consent forms were sent

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home with your child <u>vesterday</u>. The forms need to be completed fully, whether you DO or DO NOT wish your child to receive the vaccine. Please make sure you include a <u>contact telephone number</u> and return the form to school by <u>Friday 23 October 2020</u>.
