Free School Meal Vouchers Free School Meal vouchers for the <u>October half term</u> have been provided by Birmingham City Council, via a company called 'Sodexo'. If your child is eligible for free school meals, you will be receiving FSM vouchers via Parentmail this week.

### Attendance Expectations

This is a reminder that attendance continues to remain statutory, despite new national restrictions which came into force on 5th November. Below is the guidance from the Department of Education; It is vital for all children to attend school to minimise, as far as possible, the longer-term impact of the pandemic on children's education, wellbeing and wider development. Missing out on more time in the classroom risks pupils falling further behind. Those with higher overall absence tend to achieve less well in both primary and secondary school. School attendance has therefore been mandatory from the beginning of the autumn term. This means from that point, the usual rules on school attendance apply, including:

- parents' duty to secure their child's attendance regularly at school (where the child is a registered pupil at school and they are of compulsory school age)
- schools' responsibilities to record attendance and follow up absence
- the availability to issue sanctions, including fixed penalty notices in line with local authorities' codes of conduct

# Polite Reminder
