

# Children in Need

Last week was an amazing success and we are pleased to inform you that we raised a phenomenal £588!



As part of our **School Self-evaluation** process, we welcomed one of our school Governors, Mrs Anja Pawson, into school to discuss our curriculum and personal development offer this year. Mrs Pawson met with our two Assistant Heads (Mrs Mason and Mrs Beesley) along with SENDco (Mrs Jones) and Early Years Lead (Mrs B Mahon). The morning was spent touring school and evaluating the progress of our provision. Thank you to all staff for facilitating the visit, and to Anja for spending time with us. Mrs Pawson will be providing feedback to Governors later this term and we will also share her findings in a future newsletter.

Last week we also welcomed a visit from Andrew Mitchell our Member of Parliament for Sutton Coldfield. His visit was primarily to support our new venture at the front of school, where we have created our "Curiosity Garden" for Year 1 children. This important resource is being developed to provide further continuous provision opportunities for children in Key stage 1 who still require access to some aspects of the Early Years Curriculum. As parents may be aware, part of the grassed area at the front of school has been developed this term, but we have further plans for the area, should we be able to find funding streams for the additional work.

#### Giraffes

In Giraffe Class, the children have been busy exploring a bedtime routine through stories and role play, helping them understand the steps that support this routine at the end of the day.

We have also been practising how to cross the road safely, reinforcing the importance of "stop, look, and listen" during our outdoor learning sessions.

In addition, the children have been focusing on fine motor activities designed to strengthen the muscles in their upper bodies and hands, supporting their coordination, writing readiness, and overall independence.

#### **Puffins**

In Puffin Class, the children have had a magical week creating their very own wands using stick weaving, carefully choosing colours and textures before making thoughtful wishes to go with them.

In maths, we have been exploring repeating patterns using shapes, helping the children recognise, continue, and create patterns of their own.

During PE with Mr. Watts, the class enjoyed bringing our story *The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark* to life through movement, using imaginative actions to explore the themes and characters from the book.
