

Year one and Two classes are busy voting for their two class representatives this week so watch this space for when they are announced!


School council representatives will be going straight to work once elected.

Arbor Update

Yesterday you should have received a log in request for our pupil information system, Arbor.

Please log into this and check that all of the information we have for your child / children is correct and update anything necessary. You can do this on a PC or by downloading the Arbor app.

Please note: if you use Busy Bodies, you already have a log in but please check that your child's information is up to date.

The purpose of this change is to improve how we communicate with you and in future we will be using Arbor as our primary method of communication, you will also be able to reply to messages on Arbor and contact the school this way. The portal will also allow you to view your child's attendance and in the future, you will be able to book clubs and trips on here as well (we will communicate with you when this migrates over from ParentPay).
