### Performance of disadvantaged pupils 2014-2015 and 2015-2016

#### Reception

33% of pupil premium pupils met the expected standard i.e. achieved a Good level of Development at the end of the Foundation Stage in July 2016. (12 children were in receipt of PP, 8 of these 12 children were identified as having additional health related issues or receiving SEN support)

40% of pupil premium pupils met the expected standard i.e. achieved a Good Level of Development at the end of the Foundation Stage in July 2015. (11 children were in receipt of PP, 6 of these 11 children were receiving SEN support)

### Year 1 phonics:

100% of pupil premium pupils achieved the expected standard (32/40) in the Y1 phonics screening check in June 2015 and 82% of pupils achieved this in June 2016 (compared to 91% of 'other' pupils in the cohort in the school in both June 2015 and June 2016).
