Performance of disadvantaged pupils 2015-2016 and 2016-17

Reception

33% of pupil premium pupils met the expected standard i.e. achieved a Good level of Development at the end of the Foundation Stage in July 2017. (3 children were in receipt of PP, 2 of these 3 children were identified as having additional health related issues or receiving SEN support)

33% of pupil premium pupils met the expected standard i.e. achieved a Good level of Development at the end of the Foundation Stage in July 2016. (12 children were in receipt of PP, 8 of these 12 children were identified as having additional health related issues or receiving SEN support)

National other for 2016 and 2017 are 72% and 73% respectively.

Year 1 phonics:

75% of pupil premium pupils achieved the expected standard (32/40) in the Year 1 phonic screening check in June 2016-17 (12 children were in receipt of PP, 4 of whom were also SEN)

82% of pupil premium pupils achieved the expected standard (32/40) in the Y1 phonics screening check in June 2016.

National other for 2017 is 84%.
