We also know that transition between the play-based curriculum of Reception and the National Curriculum of Year One is a big step for children. In this first half term of Year One we continue to give the Year One children some extra play activities to make the transition a little easier for them.

Consent for Data – urgent information

As you are aware, we have sent out to parents/quardians of children in Reception to Year Two a flu consent booklet. Can you please return the booklets to school as soon as possible. We have been asked by the NHS Birmingham Community Healthcare Immunisation team to provide them with the telephone numbers of parents/quardians, to include both those parents/quardians who have returned the consent booklet and those who have not. We therefore ask that if you DO NOT wish your telephone number to be given to the immunisation team, you advise the school office by the end of this week (Friday 20th September 2019).

School Census - Please Help!

We have to complete a detailed School Census on behalf of the Department for Education three times every year. The first date this year is Thursday 3rd October. This is the mechanism by which the school receives funding for pupils. It is absolutely essential that we claim all of the money that the school is entitled to receive to maintain our standards at Boldmere. One of the areas that we are asked to complete, is the number of children with a parent or parents who are Service Personnel serving in regular HM Forces military units or in the Armed Forces of another nation and stationed in England. Members of the Territorial Army are not classed as the regular armed forces for the purpose of the Census. The other specific group that we are required to complete is the number of children adopted from care. The DfE asks parents to provide supporting evidence, such as a photocopy of the adoption order. We realise that this is sensitive information and need to assure parents that this information is confidential and will only be used for completion of the Census. The funding for school dinners is also based on the number of dinners provided on that day and we ask for as much support as possible on this census day. We will be sending invitations out to those who usually have a packed lunch so please make sure you
