Dear Parents/Carers,

Challenges and Update of Full School Opening:

Our priority since the return to school has been to welcome back all children from Y1 to Y6 and to settle our new Reception and Nursery children into school. We have concentrated on familiarising children with the new school routines and assessing them so that we can plan appropriately to provide a recovery curriculum. The atmosphere in school is positive and it has been lovely to hear children back in the school!

However, the full opening of school has presented many challenges. We have been learning how to function in our new 'normal', constantly reviewing new guidance (which is often conflicting) and updating our safeguarding procedures. Unfortunately, we have also had a number of staff who are or have been unable to attend school as they have either been ill themselves or are awaiting test results for themselves or dependents. To date, we have had two positive results for staff and a further two for children.

In the last hour we have been notified that our Executive Head Carl Glasgow has tested positive for COVID-19. We wish Mr. Glasgow a speedy recovery. I am in regular discussion with our Chair of Governors and Public Health regarding the ongoing COVID 19 risk to the school. We have had 5 positive COVID-19 cases in as many days. At present we ask all parents / carers to have an increased awareness for both their own symptoms and symptoms developed by their children and to follow national and local COVID-19 guidance.

As I am sure you can appreciate the school has increasing staffing pressures and are managing situation on a daily basis. The safety of the children is paramount and we advise that all parents / carers monitor for any updates from the school.

The situation is changing daily and we are adapting as we go. We are working hard to balance delivering the curriculum within a safe and happy environment with minimising movement around school while covering absences. As you can imagine, it is a challenge the like of which no school has ever faced before. However, we will endeavour to follow all procedures and continue to provide a safe environment and appropriate learning for your children. We have also been working behind the scenes to create a robust remote learning platform that is now available to children who are at home due to self-isolation. This will be delivered through Google Classroom. The provision is much improved on that we were able to provide prior to the summer.

Children have been issued logins to access their work when at home self-isolating. You will receive a Parentmail later today with information on how to log on. Nursery children will receive their logins on Monday 5th October. Please also refer to the school website's 'Home Learning' section, under your child's year group page, where a step by step guide and information about Google Classroom and our remote learning can be found.

I do need to stress however that this remote learning provision does not at this time include teacher contact via Zoom or Teams. There are several reasons for this and we will communicate further as soon as possible, but primarily, it is because staff who are self-isolating are not expected to provide live teaching sessions virtually, while those in school are engaged with in-school teaching, including covering for those currently absent. This position is under constant review.

We are sure that most parents will understand and accept this, and join us in wishing all staff and children with COVID-19 a speedy recovery.

I would like to take this time to thank you for your patience and cooperation as we continue to navigate through these unprecedented times.
