Think about the perspective of others.


Identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally.

Know and take about the different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing; physical activity, healthy eating, tooth brushing, sensible amounts of 'screen time', having a good sleep routine, being a safe pedestrian.

Literacy

Children are learning to:



Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences. Form lower-case and capital letters correctly.

Spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the sound with letter/s.

Read a few common exception words matched to the school's phonic programme.

Read simple phrases and sentences made up of words with known letter—sound correspondences and, where necessary, a few exception words

Write short sentences with words with known lettersound correspondences using a capital letter and full stop.

Communication and Language

Children are learning to:

Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them.

Engage in non-fiction books.

Use new vocabulary in different contexts.

Retell a story, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text, some as exact repetition and in their own words.

Learn rhymes, poems and songs.

Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other.


Explore the natural world around them.
