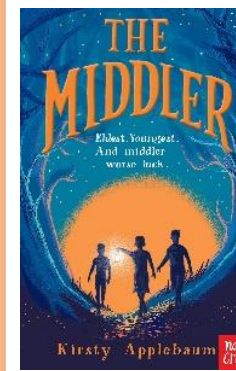

humiliation	To make someone feel ashamed and foolish.

Courage, Democracy Vs Dictatorship, Loyalty, Slavery Vs Freedom, Friendship and Truth.

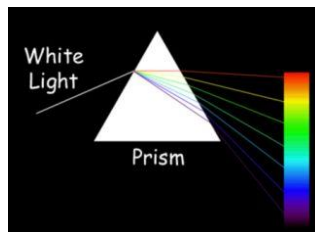
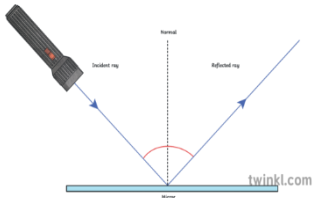
Setting

Characters

Maggie Cruise	Protagonist - A Middler who seeks to be as special as an eldest and ends up in contact with 'Wanderers'.
Jed Cruise	The eldest of the family who is eventually sent to camp.
Trig Cruise	The youngest in the family, full of love and laughter.
Mum and Dad	Parents of the three children.
Lindi Chowdhry	Another eldest who hits her head at the start of the book.
Mrs Zimmerman	The head teacher of the local school.
Mayor Anderson	Antagonist - Has overall control in the town of Fennis Wick.
Elsie Wetheral	Old lady who can predict the weather (a.k.a. Elsie Weather)
Mr Wetheral	Old man who paints life-like portraits of eldests.
Robbie, Grif, Neel and Lyle Parker	Four brothers who were on the scene when Lindi first cracked her head on a gravestone.
Una Opal	A young girl wanderer who Maggie initially seeks to help.
Mr Opal	Father of Una Opal who frightens Maggie
Fredrick Gabby	A young boy who is thought to have crossed the boundary, been locked away and then turned mute.
Mrs Gabby	Mother of Fredrick Gabby who owns the laundrette.

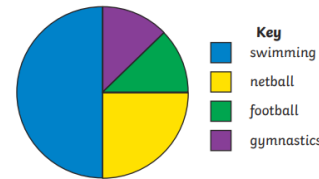

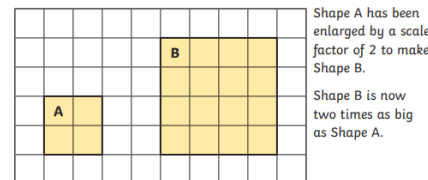
Key Vocabulary

light	A form of energy that travels in a wave from a source.
light source	An object that makes its own light.
reflection	Reflection is when light bounces off a surface, changing the direction of a ray of light.
incident ray	A ray of light that hits a surface.
reflected ray	A ray of light that has bounced back after hitting a surface.
the law of reflection	The law states that the angle of the incident ray is equal to the angle of the reflected ray.
