On behalf of all at Cure Leukaemia, we would like to say a huge thank you for organising 'Camp for a Cure' for all the teachers and children at Boldmere School. It was such a fantastic opportunity, and we really hope we can continue 'Camping for a Cure' for many years to come!

The phenomenal efforts of all involved resulted in over £6,700 being raised for Birmingham-based National blood cancer charity Cure Leukaemia. Every penny raised going towards funding specialist Research Nurses at 13 major hospitals across the UK including the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Birmingham.


These nurses, who operate within the Trials Acceleration Programme (TAP), connect blood cancer patients with potentially life-saving clinical trials not currently available through the NHS. Without the nurses, these trials would not be possible, and patients would miss the chance to access drugs that have the potential to save their lives.

It is estimated that for every £10 raised for Cure Leukaemia, this can leverage ten times that amount in free drugs from pharmaceutical drugs used in these trials. That means the £6,700 raised by Camping for a Cure will give patients access to a staggering £67,000 worth of potentially life-saving drugs.

You should be immensely proud of your community efforts and team spirit, and we are again, beyond grateful for everything you have done for Cure Leukaemia.
